### 4TH QUARTER ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

#### **COVID-19-RELATED ISSUANCES**

The LGCDD, under the guidance of Division Chief Catherine G. Allam-Miranda and Assistant Division Chief Elsbeth T. Maralli ensured that all COVID-19-related issuances and communication from the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF), Office of the SILG and DILG Central Office and other partner-agencies were disseminated to the concerned local government units through the DILG Provincial Offices.

Further, the division also ensured that COVID-19-related issuances initiated by the Regional Director were prepared and disseminated.

#### **PROVISION OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE**

### DILG REGION 02 EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER (EOC)

In compliance with CVRDRRMC-RIATF Memorandum No. 19, s.2020, the DILG Regional Emergency Operations Center (EOC) for COVID-19 remained activated until December 31, 2020. It is composed of the Local Government Capability Development Division (LGCDD) personnel.

### COVID-19 Programs Assisted

The EOC ensured that all issues/concerns on the following were properly coordinated to the DILG R2 Field Offices, partner-agencies, local government units and other DILG Regional Offices:

- Locally-Stranded Individuals (LSIs)
- Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs)

- Social Amelioration Program (SAP) Weekly Reports Attended

### ✓ SUPPORT TO CONTACT TRACING OPERATIONS

Following the World Health Organization (WHO) recommended ratio for Contact Tracers (CTs) and community population of 1:800, the Philippines need an estimated 130,000 contact tracers. At present, there are around 130,000 contact tracers including volunteers. With this current number, DILG necessitates the hiring of additional 50,000 contact tracers more and in Region 02, **1215 quota** was provided.



The Department of the Interior and Local Government Region 2 (DILG R2) as the lead agency in facilitating the hiring and deployment of CTs in the region to augment CTs in LGUs, issued the following issuances to all City/Municipal Mayors, Provincial Directors, Cluster Heads, Program Managers, Regional/Provincial CT Focal Persons, Hired Contact Tracers to set supporting guidelines and clearer approach to facilitate the deployment of hired Contact Tracers in the Region:

- ✓ Regional Memorandum Circular No. 13 dated 30 September 2020 re: GUIDELINES ON THE DEPLOYMENT OF CONTACT TRACERS IN REGION 02
- ✓ Regional Memorandum dated 1 October 2020 re: DEPLOYMENT OF CONTACT TRACERS (CTs) IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (LGUs) WITH COVID 19 CASES

The LGMED, as the overseer in the entire operation and monitoring of Contact Tracing Activities had continuously monitored the recruitment and selection of CTs, conduct of Basic CT Training Course and Deployment as follows:

### Virtual Training for Newly-Hired Contact Tracers

In accordance with Republic Act No. 11494 otherwise known as the "Bayanihan to Recover as One Act" or Bayanihan 2 Law, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Regional Office 02 had an allocation of 1, 215 contact tracers to be deployed in the different Local Government Units in the Cagayan Valley Region to significantly ramp-up the region's contact tracing program.

The hired contact tracers will be deployed in the different provinces/cities/municipalities of the region that shall be responsible of tracking down the close contacts of confirmed COVID-19 patients. On October 1, 2020, a Pre-Planning Meeting was conducted for the Contact Tracers' Training. There were a total of 1, 233 contact tracers and due to the huge number, the contact tracers were divided into **5** batches, who participated in the *Virtual Training for Newly-Hired Contact Tracers* on **October 3, 5, 6, 7 and 16, 2020**, as follows:

#### Resolutions Drafted

On the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter, October 1 – December 31, 2020, a total of **eighty-four (84) Resolutions** were drafted and adopted by the CV-RIATF.

#### PERFORMANCE CHALLENGE FUND

The Performance Challenge Fund (PCF) has also conducted several activities taking into consideration the challenges and restrictions caused by the COVID 19 pandemic.

In place of a face-to-face dialogue with LGU officals, the RPDMU conducted an **Interactive Dialogue with the Municipality of Solano, Nueva Vizcaya** on October 9, 2020 via Google Meet to discuss updates on the implementation of their 2019 PCF project and finalize commitment to complete the project within the prescribed timeline.

Moreover, PCF Regional and Provincial Focal persons, Cluster Heads and their cluster staff and Engineers also participated in the **Hands-on Training on PCF Website** on November 20, 2020 via Zoom Video Conferencing. This activity was very timely as onsite project monitoring was not feasible due to the mandatory health protocols and travel restrictions posted by the Covid. The activity served as a venue to capacitate the participants on the use and navigation of the website. The website is a strategy to strengthen the reporting of PCF project implementation to the Central Office.

### Conduct of Lupong Tagapamayapa Incentives Awards (LTIA) Guidelines Enhancement

The Local Government Monitoring and Evaluation Division (LGMED) conducted the LTIA Guidelines Enhancement on November 23, 2020 at the DILG Regional Office 2, in preparation for the upcoming LTIA assessment through Online System. It was participated by the LGMED personnel and LTIA Provincial Focal Persons.

The activity commence with the welcome remarks of DC Digna R. Herrera. Afterwhich, she briefly discussed what is Katarungang Pambarangay, its legal bases, and she gave emphasis on the importance of Lupong Tagapamayapa in promoting speedy administration of Justice.

LGOO V Jasmin O. Aresta followed, discussing the overview of LTIA and informed the new members of the division that the search is done annually. She further stated that LTIA recognizes outstanding LT that





demonstrates exemplary performance and commendable contributions in the promotion of Katarungang Pambarangay.

She further stated that the objective of the LTIA are to institutionalize a systme of granting economic benefits and other incentives to Lupong Tagapamayapa that demonstrates exemplary performance and to generate greater awareness among, and support from, the various sectors of the Philippine society on the KP as a potent vehicle toward social order and human development.

The Office of the Regional Director-Legal Services Unit caters not only cases endorsed by the Bantay Korapsyon-PMO but likewise accommodates complaints from the Hotline 8888, Public Assistance and Complaint Center and Presidential Complaint Center and other form, rendering technical assistance in fact-finding activities, legal opinion and legal assistance.

The 8888 Citizen's Hotline and Complaint Center (Hotline 8888) which serves as a mechanism where citizens may report their complaints and grievances on acts red tape, graft and corruption practices by the government officials and employees and slow and efficient delivery of government services and requests for government assistance.

With the required technical application of laws, rules and relevant jurisprudence, the ORD-Legal Services Unit handles the Hotline 8888, all of the 103 received tickets were endorsed to the concerned Field Offices, other national and local agencies, and LGUs as this requires concrete and specific action within 72-hour as mandated by law. While, 77 out of 103 received were closed with a 74.75% closing rate and this level is yet to close 26 tickets or 25. 24% of the received tickets.

From October to December 2020 this level has received a total of twenty six (26) complaints lodged through other channels such as



emails, phone calls and other means, some requiring further substantiation while others require further verification through the conduct of a Fact Finding Investigation, which, in and of itself, requires another layer of technical expertise on the subject field.

Further, the unit caters to Local Government Units and Functionaries and the various DILG Field Offices, whenever there are requests for Legal Opinions, for the last quarter this level thus far received a total of nineteen (19) request for Legal Opinion which has been promptly acted upon. We likewise continued to extend legal services to public as BK personnel by catering to queries and clarifications on some issues. This year, a total of eleven (11) legal assistance were rendered to walk-in clients.

### ACTIVITIES OF THE BANTAY KORAPSYON (BK) FOR THE LAST QUARTER

### **2ND ANNUAL CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION**



In order to be apprised of latest laws, jurisprudence, and department opinions, the DILG R2- Legal Services Unit facilitated the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Continuing Legal Education for the LGOOs across the region. More than 90 participants actively attended the webinar via Google Meet. This webinar was made possible by the legal luminaries invited namely, Atty. Romeo P. Benitez, Director IV of the Legal and Legislative Liaison Service of the DILG Central Office and Senior Assistant Regional Prosecutor Carolyn Deray-Ramos of the Department of Justice- National Prosecution Service. Atty. Romeo Benitez thoroughly discussed about ordinances, resolutions, and executive orders by citing cases decided by the Supreme Court, several Legal Opinions of the DILG, and other related laws in order to





fully grasp the differences between ordinances, executive orders, and resolutions.

Senior Assistant Regional Prosecutor Carolyn Deray-Ramos, on the other hand, discussed the Katarungang Pambarangay by highlighting its mandate under Republic Act no. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 under Articles 196 to 201 Rule XXVI thereof.

This activity had surely strengthened the legal knowledge of the field officers of DILG R2 as they carry out their functions in overseeing, nurturing, and empowering the local government units throughout the region. This is evident by the positive result of the post-activity evaluation below where 21 or 73% rated the activity as excellent.

Nueva, Vizcaya regarding the renewal of Financial Technical Assistance Agreement involving OceanaGold Philippines Inc. pending before the Office of the President. A continuous fact-finding investigation is being conducted by the Regional Office thru the Legal Unit. On December 15, 2020, BK personnel, together with the Regional Legal Officer, conducted ocular inspection on the mining site in Didipio, Kasibu, Nueva Vizcaya, for several complaints received and on the issue of barricade employed by local residents.

Cagayan Governor Manuel N. Mamba also touched on the possible dredging of the river to mitigate the effects of typhoons and rains to the region which he believes will also open the region to more trade and business opportunities.



# Conduct of Planning Workshop for the Barangay Roll-out Training on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (PCVE)

#### RETOOLED COMMUNITY SUPPORT PROGRAM

### Sectoral Interventions for RCSP CY 2021 Target Barangays Ascertained

DILG Regional Director Jonathan Paul M. Leusen, Jr., CESO III leads in the implementation of the Retooled Community Support Program (RCSP) in the National Task Force on the Elimination of Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC) CY 2021 target barangays. Six (6) barangays were included in the list for CY 2021 where developmental interventions are set to be implemented in these insurgency-cleared areas in the Province of Cagayan.

'Tables of peace' dialogues and sectoral validation of issues were successfully conducted with the women, farmers, Indigenous Peoples, and the youth sectors in September 2020. DILG Cagayan Provincial Director Ruperto B. Maribbay, Jr. CESO V and concerned Provincial Staff and MLGOOs together with the RCSP Regional Focal Person Genevieve R. Alipio and ADAC Technical Assistant Ian Michael T. Pascual assisted in facilitating the RCSP activities in the province. Proposed infrastructure projects to be implemented were validated and finalized by the Regional Planning and Development Unit (RPDMU). LGU beneficiaries to the Php 20 million grant are the municipalities of Rizal, Sto. Niño, and Piat, Cagayan.

EO 70 mandates a whole-of-nation approach to eradicate the 5-decade long communist insurgency in the communities during President Rodrigo R. Duterte's administration. Echoing such principle, during the webinar session on Improving Access to Basic Services in the Countryside, DILG Secretary Eduardo Año said that, "If we unite and help one another, peace will go beyond aspiration and become a reality".

#### SOCIALLY-PROTECTIVE LGUS

#### Sagana at Ligtas na Tubig sa Lahat (SALINTUBIG) and Assistance to Municipalities Program

The pandemic has also raised immediate concerns on water, sanitation and hygiene and awareness on frequent and proper handwashing. Aligned with this is the need to address gaps on availability of potable water systems and handwashing facilities not only in households but also in public places and spaces such as public markets, parks/playgrounds and schools. On October 27-29, 2020, the RPDMU conducted the clustered **Training on the Preparation of the Municipal Water Supply and Sanitation Master Plan (Phase 1: Sector Assessment)** in partnership with PDMUs of regions CAR, I and OPDS staff and WATSAN Hubs for selected Local Government Units on the use of the iWaSH sector assessment tools in order to effectively administer and gather comprehensive data from the target stakeholders/respondents. Data gathered thru the tools shall be consolidated and analyzed as inputs later in the second phase of the training which is the actual preparation of the master plan.




Prior to the actual trainings, trainings for the PDMUs and WATSAN Hubs were attended as resource speakers will come from said offices.






#### Public Market and Public Cemeteries Projects



#### Conditional Matching Grant to Provinces (CMGP)

On December 2-4, 2020, DILG Provincial Offices of Batanes, Cagayan and Nueva Vizcaya, in coordination with the Regional Project Development and Monitoring Office (RPDMU) conducted a **Retooling Workshop on Environmental and Social Safeguards**, which highlighted the formulation of the Environmental Management Plan (EMP). The latter is required by CMGP to ensure that Provincial Governments conduct necessary environmental assessment before construction which includes, but is not limited to, Impact Management Plan and Environmental Monitoring Plan.



The annual CMGP Program Implementation Review (PIR) and 2021 Annual Reform Action Plan (ARAP) Formulation was conducted on December 7, 2020 and December 14-15, 2020. The five (5) provinces, specifically their Local Road Management Team (LRMT), actively participated in the activity. Regional Director Jonathan Paul M. 
the invaluable efforts of the LGUs in implementing CMGP projects amid COVID-19.

#### I. LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT
